What Were You Arguing About?

Mark 9:30-36; Luke 22:24-26

- We're looking at the questions of Jesus to help us discover the concerns that are on His heart.
- In asking His disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?" (Mk. 9:33),
 Jesus was exposing the way they looked for greatness in self-promotion.
 There are several places He addressed this issue and we'll explore His teaching
 using two categories...

The Trap of Self-Promotion

- · When we look for greatness through self-promotion...
- ➤ We are anxiously driven by comparison. (Mk. 9:36-37)
- ➤ We easily miss God's greater agenda. (Luke 22:14-15;24)
- ➤ We lose our distinctiveness. (Luke 22:24-26)

The Invitation to the Greatness of Service

- ➤ Humble service is rooted in godly identity. (John 13:3)
- > Humble service ultimately leads to the fulfillment we're looking for. (Mk. 9:35)
- > Humble service simply serves the "face in front of me." (Mk. 9:37)

Discussion/Reflection Questions

- Why do you think the disciples were arguing about who was the greatest?
 What do you think motivated this? In what ways do you see these same motives at work in your life?
- What are the results of living our lives trying to forge the image that we're "greater" than others?
- Why is humble service best rooted in an identity formed by God's love and truth?
- In what ways can humbly serving others provide meaningful fulfillment?
- What does it mean to you to "love the face in front of you?"

Welcome to McKernan Baptist Church! We are so glad you have joined us either in person or online this Sunday. Today's question challenges us to avoid the trap of self-promotion and invites us to Jesus' greater way of humble service.

When He (Jesus) was in the house,
He asked them, "What were you arguing about on the road?"
But they kept quiet because on the way
they had argued about who was the greatest.

- Mark 9:33-34 (NIV)

If Jesus directed the same question to contemporary followers that He asked His first disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?" the answer will be no less embarrassing. Christians still jockey for prominence. The unbridled will to power still surfaces,...destroying fellowship and eviscerating Christian love. Little has changed.
